SUBJECT: Facilities Information Management System (FIMS) Version 1.5 Release

Today, Monday February 28, 2005, version 1.5 of the Facilities Information Management System (FIMS) was released. These enhancements are automatically available to you when you log into FIMS from your browser. The following system enhancements are included in this new release.

- 'Land Agreement' has been added to the Owned/Ingrant picklist for New Land processing to allow the tracking of land ownership that is specific to Legacy Management. This includes land records for sites where the cleanup is completed and there is no present activity other than being a long-term record custodian. This new ownership designation is to also include land records for sites where DOE maintains responsibility for various levels of activity including but not limited to site inspections, sampling and monitoring, maintaining compliance with institutional controls, and where DOE is party to agreements for long term remedies.
- A new data element called "Regulatory Basis" has been added to the Land Info window for Land records where the owned/ingrant designation is 'Land Agreement'. This field is used to designate the federal program and legislation established to identify, remediate, and manage legacy waste. Valid picklist choices are CERCLA, FUSRAP, NWPA Section 151 [c], RCRA, UMTRCA Title I, UMTRCA Title II, and Other.
- Reports 035 and 084 were modified to provide reporting for the new 'Land Agreement' land records.
- The FIMSWEB.MDB ad-hoc query database has been updated to include the Regulatory Basis data element. You can download the updated file from the FIMS web site at <http://fims.hr.doe.gov/downloads.htm>.
- The FIMS User's Guide, FIMS Reporting Guide, and FIMS Data Element Dictionary have been updated to reflect all of the above changes. These documents are available from the FIMS website at <http://fims.hr.doe.gov/documentation.htm>.
